The Power of Praying for Charities to Break Links with Barclays



This month brought a big win for Christian Climate Action (CCA) as Christian Aid announced that they have closed their account with Barclays - Europe's biggest funders of fossil fuels. At the end of last year CCA held a vigil outside Christian Aid's headquarters and met with their board to discuss concerns regarding the charity's account with Barclays. Following this meeting, Christian Aid said that they would review their banking arrangements.

CCA are now holding a **series of vigils**, calling on other charities to break their links with Barclays bank. Other charities that bank with Barclays include World Vision, BMS World Vision, Tearfund, Leprosy Mission and **Greenbelt Festival**.

Barclays continue to support the expansion of fossil fuel projects despite all the scientific evidence that these must stop if we are to limit global warming. Holly-Anna Petersen, from Sheffield, explained why she is taking part in the vigils: "In this critical time for life on our planet, it is important that charities put their money where their mouth is. If they are declaring their positive impact, they need to move away from this destructive bank."

The series of vigils kicked off on the 11th August, with a prayer vigil outside the headquarters of the Catholic development agency, **CAFOD**. Participants prayed for and with the charity as they consider their banking arrangements - specifically that CAFOD might drop their account with Barclays.

Members of the Catholic movement Laudato Si joined the vigil, along with some CAFOD

members. Volunteers with the charity also came and talked with vigil participants. The Barclays account is a secondary account for CAFOD, their primary accounts being with RBS and the Co-Op.

An Evening with John Dear Wednesday October 18th, 7.30pm


CCA is really excited to be organising this event! Come and hear about the rich tradition of civil disobedience

It covers both the biblical roots of nonviolent civil disobedience and the practicalities of how to prepare for, do and deal with the consequences of, nonviolent civil disobedience. Originally published in 1994, it was updated in 2022 by Christopher David and CCA's Rev Sue Parfit. Join us over six evenings as we work through the book and discuss what it might mean for us. 
