**Please bring some food to share**

*Jan Winslade writes:*

At the final prayer and planning meeting held at the Salvation Army on Wed 22<sup>nd</sup> May, our monthly prayers for guidance were answered.

We have a new plan for FPCT to bring us up into the 21<sup>st</sup> century. We propose:

- 1) To **emphasize the role of individual Christians** in working together effectively by adopting a revised strapline "Christians working together to share the love of God" alongside the existing Falmouth and Penryn Churches Together logo, which is widely respected (and used on the new polo shirts bought last year for the Tall Ships outreach!).
- 2) To re-imagine FPCT as **a network rather than an organization**, helping to co-ordinate support for mission initiatives developed by the churches, including:
  - a. Penryn and Falmouth Foodbank and Dwell café (Highway)
  - b. Christians Against Poverty (CAP) (Budock and EBC)
  - c. Care Home Ministry (multiple churches)
  - d. Fairtrade Falmouth (St Mary's, University and others)

- e. Justice and Peace Action Group (multiple churches)
- f. School Chaplaincy (Light and Life)
- g. University Chaplaincy (multiple churches)
- h. Footsteps Community Café (Methodist and multiple churches)
- i. Healing Clinic (Stirring of the Water)
- j. Christmas events/Christmas card (multiple churches)
- k. Good Friday/Easter witness (multiple churches)
- l. Outreach to special events (e.g Tall Ships)
- m. Also encouraging efforts to re-introduce Street Pastors, Open the Book and other initiatives.
- n. Developing new opportunities to meet people where they are and raise awareness of how our churches are working together.

As this list (and our Annual Report, available on 12 June) shows, the range of ecumenical work in our area is already extensive, involving many churches and individuals, and FPCT will work to promote, encourage and support all such initiatives, managed by local churches and groups. We know that even so, need outstrips demand and leaders and volunteers are overstretched. Our 'prayer and planning' meetings over the past year as we have sought direction for FPCT have borne much fruit and we will continue to **gather regularly for prayer** for our area and all ministering to its needs.

3) To replace the existing structure of officers/Executive/Forum with a **Co-ordination Team** representing as many denominations as possible, which will share tasks as needed to avoid overburdening individuals. Nominations for this team are now open, details below. The Team will review the existing FPCT constitution and propose changes for ratification by the churches as desired. It will meet regularly and arrange open topic-based or social gatherings to allow everyone to share news and ideas.

**These proposals will be taken to our AGM 'Food, Fellowship and the Future' on Wednesday 12 June at 6.30pm at St Mary's Church Hall, Killigrew St (please note change of time and location). This will begin with a bring and share meal so please bring some food to share - many thanks! Some assistance to set up tables and chairs beforehand would also be welcome. (Please note there is a service in the church at 6pm so car parking space may be limited)**

If you have ever been involved or would like to know more about the revival of the Street Pastors in Falmouth.


Please join us at 7pm on Monday the 3rd of June at Emanuel Baptist church on Western Terrace.

**Challenging Times:** Due to the economic situation, we have a lot more clients, many of whom are working and still finding it hard to make ends meet and at the same time we are not receiving as many food donations as we did in recent times.
