Dr. Sarah Williams feels called to help the Church regain its memory. Sarah, a church historian, will assist us in examining previous city-transforming movements to learn from their examples and practices. How can we deepen our spiritual lives within the context and values of today's culture? How do we live as followers of Christ in cities that are in constant crisis and flux?

Drawing from examples from the early centuries of the church to the Clapham sect in the 18th and 19th centuries, Sarah will look at the spiritual practices that sustain long-term transformation in a place.

Sarah is an engaging communicator with a passion to see the lessons and examples of the historical church affect today's practices.
